



COVID-19 UPDATE

Dear Residents and Families/Representatives,

Please accept this letter as our update on the status of COVID-19 in our facility.

We will continue to notify you through our website of any changes in visitation procedures and if we receive confirmation of new positive case in our facility. We will reach out to you individually if your loved one is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or tests positive for COVID-19.

Visitation

Visitation continues to stay open, but we have extended our visitation hours to **9:00am to 7:00pm**. If you would like to visit outside of that time period please make arrangements with our administrator, Julie Liebo. We encourage visitation during this time period due to the clinical care that must take place early in the morning and in the evening. We thank you for your understanding and working with us to ensure the residents are able to be provided care in a timely manner.

Room visits can be denied if it could harm the health of a resident. You can hug your loved ones but please try to keep a distance when possible. We **cannot** provide masks when you come to visit, please bring your own. Not bringing your own may prevent you from visiting.

We are open to visitors that are **under 18**, but they must follow the same policies and rules we have set for visitation which includes wearing a mask and signing in when entering the facility.

General Visitation Policy:

- Must check in with the receptionist, answer questions and take temperature
- Must wear proper masks and other PPE through the whole visit
- You may only visit the person you came to see, walking around the halls is discouraged.
- Due to the space in the rooms, we encourage that there are only two visitors in the rooms. Visitation can take place in other parts of the facility as well such as outdoor patios and common spaces.
- Please notify staff when you leave so proper cleaning can be completed.

Facility Safety Precautions:

We continue to practice the enhanced safety precautions that are known to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Our residents are continually monitored and staff is using PPE as recommended by the CDC. Staff is frequently reminded and encouraged to practice social distancing and to use hand sanitizer and frequently wash their hands when they are in the facility and out in the community. We ask them not to report to work if they have symptoms of illness.

Our facility encourages vaccination for COVID-19. If you would like to receive a vaccine or think you need to be tested for COVID-19 we can provide that for you and your loved ones.
